If you want to apply for that leadership position, you **MUST** fill out the Student Success Leader application for the College of Agricultural Sciences and Natural Resources. The SAM application can be found at casnr.okstate.edu/application.

APPLICATION STEPS:

- Fill out the third page of this packet
 - Candidates **MUST** check "yes" under Statement of Release
- Type your answers to the questions on a separate sheet of paper
- Attach a résumé that includes other club/leadership involvement, community activities, competitive teams you will travel with and job information (this should not exceed two pages)
- Attach a list of references (at least one must be a faculty member at OSU)
- Sign and date contract on the second page of this packet indicating you have read and understand the expectations and duties of an ASLA member

SELECTION PROCESS

- Complete the application form, essay questions, résumé, list of references and member contract
- Submit application material to ANSI 104 by **5:00 p.m. Friday, February 23**
- Applications will be screened and applicants will be notified by March 5 if they are invited to interview
- Interviews will be conducted in the evenings of March 27 & 28
